ASSOCIATE IN SCIENCE (A.S.) DEGREE IN BUSINESS

Associate Degree Programs of the Department of Business Administration are nationally accredited by the Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs.

The Accounting concentration assists students in developing analytical skills through a critical exploration of the fundamentals of accounting and the use of accounting for decision-making purposes. Students use the latest technology to perform various accounting functions. In addition, students work on developing communication, interpersonal, leadership and teamwork skills. This concentration prepares students for entry-level positions in public, private and governmental agencies such as accounting clerk, staff accountant, accounting assistant, bookkeeper, assistant auditor and tax preparer. Students may also choose to transfer to four-year institutions to earn bachelor's degrees and should consult colleges for information on transferable courses.

*Math at the 1000 level. MATH 1670 and 1680 are recommended for students who plan to transfer to a four-year institution. MATH 1600 and 1620 are recommended for students who do not plan to transfer.

TRANSFER OPTIONS

OPTION 1: Complete the CCRI Business degree program and transfer to one of the four-year colleges with which CCRI has transfer agreements in RI and out of state. Course credits transfer differently from college to college. Consult with Advising & Counseling for specifics. Under RIBGHE articulation transfer policy, students completing a CCRI associate's degree in business with a 2.4 GPA are guaranteed admission to Rhode Island College (RIC) or University of Rhode Island (URI). The applicability of courses toward the baccalaureate degree is determined by the receiving institution.

OPTION 2: Participate in the corresponding Joint Admissions Agreement (JAA) and follow the requirements for a JAA Transition Plan for Business Administration to transfer to RIC or URI. JAA students who complete the courses specified in the corresponding JAA business administration Transition Plan are guaranteed admission to either Rhode Island College (RIC) or University of Rhode Island (URI) if they maintain at least a 2.4 GPA.
