PROGRAM OVERVIEW

CCRI Kids' College offers children ages 8 through 12 a meaningful summer experience that combines innovative enrichment programs with a recreation program focusing on skill-building and sportsmanship. The morning classes, taught by seasoned, caring professionals, are small – limited to 14 students and emphasize investigation, discovery and creativity in a hands-on format. Physical education teachers supervise the afternoon athletic and recreation programs.

SCHEDULE

Kids' College will be offered in two sessions, July 13 to 24 and July 27 to Aug. 7. Students may attend one or both sessions. The daily schedule runs from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. For parental convenience, students may be dropped off at 8 a.m. Students will attend three classes each day of camp from 8:30 a.m. to 12:45 p.m. Lunch is scheduled from 12:45 to 1:15 p.m.; students may bring a lunch or purchase food in the cafeteria. A snack will be provided at 2:30 p.m. The athletic and recreational program, which will run from 1:15 to 4 p.m., will be held outdoors, weather permitting.

New this year, in an effort to enhance each camper's experience and allow individual choices, students are asked to rank their class preferences on the registration form. Every effort will be made to grant first-choice options; classes will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Written confirmation of your session and class schedule will be sent in writing either through mail or e-mail.

TUITION RATES

The cost per two-week session is \$340. Parents/guardians are responsible for providing students with their lunches and transportation to and from Kids' College. Additional children from the same family are eligible for a reduced fee of \$325. Each two-week session is subject to the \$5 registration fee. Please note that all lab fees have been eliminated.

Opportunities exist for junior counselors (one 13-year-old per class). Those selected will learn camp counseling techniques as well as participate in the program. Payment required of junior counselors (JC) is \$325. Please call Rebecca Paglia at 401-825-2033 for availability.

Session 1: Class Descriptions

THE ART OF SELF DEFENSE — AN INTRODUCTION TO MARTIAL ARTS: Enhance your strength, flexibility and balance while improving your timing and reaction skills. Our instructor holds three black belts, a black sash and will introduce you to various non-contact striking forms (punching and kicking). Self-defense techniques and danger awareness will be incorporated throughout. No experience required.

CHAA-CHING — STARTING YOUR OWN BUSINESS Turn your bright idea into a money-making reality. When starting a business there are tricks of the trade that everyone should know. Explore topics such as how and where to advertise, what businesses will work in your area, how to get the skills you need to succeed. Design fliers, business cards, and other things important to any successful enterprise!

DESIGN TIME: Redesign your room from floor to ceiling using principles of interior design. Make accents like unique picture frames to go with your new style. The designing doesn't stop there...work on other design projects while learning techniques you can use at home.

LET'S BUILD IT: Can you build a tent out of newspaper or a bridge out of spaghetti? How far can you make a paper airplane fly? Would you like to design your own roller coaster? You'll build various projects and put science to work as you experiment ways to make your designs stronger and/or faster.

ROBO KIDS: You'll be introduced to simple machines, problem-solving skills and computer programming through the use of hands-on equipment and RCX programmable brick, Lego kit and Robo Lab software.

ROCKETS 101: Get ready to build your own rocket using the same principles as any rocket scientist. Learn about Newton's Third Law of Motion and other scientific principles that will help you and your fellow rocketeers successfully launch your creations. How high will your rocket go? How long will it stay in the air?

SCIENCE WIZARDRY: You'll be amazed at the wonderful things you can create when you take some household supplies and add a touch of chemistry! Learn how to make slime, lava, crystals and more, including science-based "tricks" to WOW your family and friends!

Session 2: Class Descriptions

ART ADVENTURE: Calling all aspiring artists! Come explore studio fundamentals of drawing, painting, designing, working with color and more. You will work on several projects that will fuel your creative process. This is your opportunity to bring your skills to a new level in an encouraging atmosphere. No prior experience is necessary.

BODY BUILDING: What is blood pressure? How long is your small intestine? What is a headache? Uncover fascinating facts as you build your body – no, not with weights, but through conducting hands-on experiments. You'll add body parts and systems to a life-size model of yourself as you discover the wonders of the human body.

BOMBS AWAY, IT'S A TREBUCHET: Hear ye, hear ye lords, ladies and knights: We're recruiting volunteers to construct trebuchets. A WHAT, you may ask? A trebuchet is a device similar to a catapult often used in medieval battles. Build your own miniature trebuchet and see whose can propel objects the farthest, attempt to knock down one another's "castles" and participate in target practice. Duck! This class is sure to be a hit.

CHAA-CHING — STARTING YOUR OWN BUSINESS Turn your bright idea into a money-making reality. When starting a business there are tricks of the trade that everyone should know. Share your favorite manga and anime books and movies as you learn about new ones. Create your own characters as you learn about plot, setting, style, dialogue and storyboarding techniques.
