The CCRI Foundation's mission is to support CCRI in changing the lives of its students. 2010 was a challenging year in many ways. In a weak economy, financial resources declined with more reductions to the state's budget for higher education. At the same time, student enrollment rose to 17,775 – the second largest enrollment in its history – as more Rhode Islanders sought a brighter future through education.

The Foundation remains more committed than ever to helping them do so. In addition to supporting the ongoing Imagine capital campaign, which has raised more than \$4.2 million to date,

the Foundation assisted students in smaller ways as well. In 2010, the Foundation established the Student Aid for Financial Emergencies (SAFE) fund to aid students in emergency situations where a relatively small amount of money might help a student overcome an unexpected personal predicament and remain enrolled. CCRI celebrates new library and dental health lab

The Community College of Rhode Island commemorated the completed renovations to its Knight Campus Library during a ribbon-cutting ceremony on Dec. 8, 2009, and the new Flanagan Campus Dental Assisting Lab during a ribbon-cutting ceremony on Dec. 15, 2009. The renovation projects were completed as part of "Imagine: The Campaign for Endless Possibilities."

At the library event, President Ray Di Pasquale presented Joshua Klemp '04, president of the CCRI Alumni Association, and former Alumni Association President Sondra V. Pitts '66 with a plaque in honor of the Association's \$25,000 contribution to the library renovation.

John S. Renza Jr., chair of the campaign steering committee, and Ruth A. Sullivan, dean of Learning Resources, spoke about the significance of the project, which has resulted in three times the number of visitors to the library.

Guests visited the library's new circulation desk, browsed the new stacks and watched a slide show of photos depicting the library before, during and after construction.

At the dental ceremony, Kathy Gazzola, chair of the Dental Health Department, and Jessica Besette '07, Dental Hygiene student and a Dental Assisting program graduate, spoke about the significance of the new lab, which is one of the top dental facilities in the country.

Attendees walked through the new lab to see its new X-ray and examination equipment while munching on hors d'oeuvres. They also toured the neighboring dental hygiene clinic where the program's seniors treat 3,000 patients every year for \$10 per visit.

Each ceremony concluded with the official ribbon-cutting led by Di Pasquale and members of the campaign steering committee.



CCRI receives gifts totaling \$297,000 to improve health programs, theater

The Community College of Rhode Island received significant gifts from the van Beuren Charitable Foundation and the Champlin Foundations that provided new technology and equipment for Allied Health programs at the Newport County Campus and led to improvements to the Bobby Hackett Theater at the Knight Campus in Warwick. Both projects are part of the "Imagine" capital campaign.

The van Beuren Charitable Foundation awarded CCRI a \$97,000 grant for two new simulation mannequins and accompanying informatics technology for nursing students in Newport. This project provides students with life-like tools they need to learn proper patient care.

"With this technology, students can be encouraged to attempt different life-saving techniques and if they make a mistake, no one gets hurt," said Richard Swearingen, a technical staff assistant and adjunct instructor of college success at CCRI's Newport campus. "Patient simulation and informatics are the future of health care education and CCRI is

proud to be a leader in the field."



The Champlin Foundations granted \$200,000 in support of renovations to the Bobby Hackett Theater at the Knight Campus in

Warwick. The plan calls for refurbishing the theater as a top quality venue with improved technology and lighting and seating for education, performance and the arts.

Caregiver fulfills goal to graduate from college

Jean Lamb of Cranston gave up a good career to take care of a sick family member, and in doing so found a new calling.

Lamb worked for 30 years in corporate and academic arenas and non-profit sectors, jobs that were as fulfilling as lucrative, but in June 2007, she resigned to devote her time to caring for her elderly aunt. Later that year, her father died unexpectedly and her mother died 15 years earlier, influencing her decision to become a caregiver.

Touched by her experience with her aunt, Lamb decided to enroll at the Community College of Rhode Island in human services with a concentration in gerontology, the study of aging and the elderly.

She began taking classes in the Spring 2008 semester while working part time as a waitress and caregiver. Lamb temporarily found herself a double caregiver when her husband needed emergency abdominal surgery during her first semester. He has had five operations since then and had to give up his job as a carpenter.

Lamb took care of her husband, her aunt and managed a household including her two children and three stepchildren while attending classes and maintaining a 3.87 grade point average. At one point or another, Lamb and all of her children were all enrolled at CCRI together.

Lamb graduated from CCRI in 2010 as a member of the Phi Theta Kappa International Honor Society and the Psi Beta Honor Society for Psychology. She also is an Honors Program graduate and received several scholarships and awards, including the Foundation's Uber-Testa Award. She is studying gerontology at URI and eventually wants to earn a master's degree in public administration to develop and implement policies and programs for the elderly.

Lamb credits CCRI with much of her success. "CCRI has been the bedrock of why I have been this successful," she said. "Everyone at the college wants you to succeed. Failure is not something they want for you, as long as you give back. It's a very reciprocal environment."

CCRI graduate finds success on third try

Deanna Dyndur of Providence is through being held back. After two false starts in college, she spent years unable to attain her dream of becoming a police officer because she lacked a higher education.

Now she has graduated from the Community College of Rhode Island with a degree in Law Enforcement and will go on to pursue a new goal – law school.

Dyndur had to change her attitude toward education before she could achieve this success, a process that took years.

Dyndur had a difficult time in middle school and high school, and this continued as she entered the work force when she discovered she needed more education to acquire a better-paying job.

Frustrated, Dyndur enrolled at CCRI in 2008 with the simple goal of doing well enough to graduate and be accepted to a police department. She felt that if a department offered her a job while she was still in school, she would drop out.

That attitude changed when she took a psychology class with Monica Lee, coordinator of CCRI's Access program, which assists first-generation or low-income students.

Lee required her students to keep a regular journal and, at the end of the semester, selected Dyndur's as the best in the class.

"That was the first positive recognition of my writing since middle school," Dyndur said. "She basically took me under her wing."

With Lee's encouragement, Dyndur joined the Access program and began taking classes full time.

She took six courses last semester while working a full workweek at Bradley Hospital as a classroom behavior specialist. She maintained a 3.83 GPA despite this rigorous schedule and graduated as a Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society member. She also was a finalist for student commencement speaker and received the Foundation's Clara Leclerc Scholarship.

After earning bachelor's and master's degrees, she said she would love to return to CCRI as an adjunct faculty member to help give back to the school that changed how she thought about learning, life and herself. "I was no longer the kid who sat in the back of class," Dyndur said. "I finally became the student I always wanted to be."

CCRI inducts two into Hall of Fame

The Community College of Rhode Island recognized Jack Renza, managing partner of Kahn, Litwin, Renza and Co., Ltd. and a longtime CCRI faculty member, and Laurie White, president of the Greater Providence Chamber of Commerce, as the 37th and 38th members of the CCRI Hall of Fame for their substantial contributions to the evolution of the college on April 18, 2010.

Renza was the first CPA to join CCRI's full-time faculty in 1975. Since then, he has taught accounting to thousands of students. Renza also has undertaken leadership roles in several high visibility activities at the college, including serving as co-chairman of CCRI President Ray Di Pasquale's inauguration. He is chairman of the college's Budget and Resource Committee as well as the highly successful "Imagine" capital campaign.



As president of the Greater Providence Chamber of Commerce, White has been instrumental in promoting the visibility of CCRI to a wide audience of business and community leaders, recognizing the critical role that the college plays in the state's workforce development. She appointed President Di Pasquale to the Greater Providence Chamber of Commerce's Board of Trustees and the college was immediately immersed in highly visible workforce

development issues. White and the Chamber are involved in several other college events. She presented, along with college officials, at a fundraising forum in Boston sponsored by the National Association of College and University Business Officers.

During the induction ceremony held at the Crowne Plaza in Warwick, Renza and White were presented with a plaque and an award in honor of their accomplishments. A tribute video including photos of the inductees throughout their lives and interviews with former colleagues was shown.

The CCRI Foundation established the Hall of Fame in celebration of the college's 30th anniversary in October 1994. It honors individuals who have excelled in their careers and made significant contributions to the mission of the college. Since 1994, seven induction ceremonies have celebrated the accomplishments of 38 Hall of Fame members.

Donor Spotlight: Lynn and Dezi Halmi

Lynn and Dezi Halmi believe in the power of education to change lives. Lynn, the campaign assistant in CCRI's Office of Institutional Advancement, has continued her education at CCRI and recently earned an associate degree in Marketing. Dezi, a principal of Primary Flow Signal, Inc., a Rhode Island-based engineering and manufacturing company that provides flow measurement equipment and services worldwide, inherited his father's values of pursuing knowledge for self-improvement.

Now the Halmis are enabling CCRI students to benefit from a higher education. They have established a \$10,000 scholarship through the CCRI Foundation, the Dezsoe Halmi Memorial Scholarship, created in tribute to Dezi's father who died 14 years ago. The scholarship will benefit engineering students.

"My dad was a very brilliant man and an extraordinary engineer with many patents to his name," said Dezi, who immigrated to the United States from Hungary with his parents at the age of 3 in 1956 to escape the Communist Revolution. During the courageous escape to a new country, the family lost money and important documents, including Dezsoe's education certificates. Unfazed, Dezsoe started a new life for his family, eventually founding Primary Flow Signal.

The spirit of Dezsoe's triumphs and dedication to education inspired the Halmis to give back in his honor. As Lynn's involvement in CCRI's "Imagine" capital campaign grew, the more the Halmis wanted to become involved with the growth of the college.

"CCRI is a remarkable institution that offers unparalleled accessibility to those with the work ethic and drive to succeed," Dezi said. "We are humbled and privileged to be a small part of it."

The Community College of Rhode Island raised more than \$30,000 for the Ferland/DiMaria Student Assistance Fund through its 2009 CCRI Fall Classic held at the Warwick Country Club on Sept. 21, 2010. The fund provides scholarships as well as financial assistance to students.

Key sponsors of the tournament included Honeywell, Independent Insurance Agents of Rhode Island, Ikon Office Systems, Lifespan, National Grid and Pare Corporation. Nearly 20 corporate foursome sponsors and 29 tee and green sponsors also provided key contributions. The annual tournament was established by Joe DiMaria and Ray Ferland, two former college administrators, 16 years ago. Since its inception, proceeds from the tournament have provided nearly \$300,000 for deserving students, who have benefited from scholarship and financial assistance in order to help them attain their college degree and to become part of the economic vitality of the state of Rhode Island.

Alumni Association gives scholarships, book awards

The CCRI Alumni Association awarded scholarships to students Daniel Murphy of Cranston and Kellie Randall of West Greenwich in support of their studies in the Fall 2010 semester. The \$1,250 scholarship was established in 1980 to recognize an enrolled student who will graduate from the CCRI. Funds for the scholarship are provided by donations to the Alumni Annual Fund.

Murphy is a Dean's List student with a 3.63 GPA in CCRI's Human Services program. Four years after struggling with alcoholism, he has turned his life around, attending college and working full time as a substance abuse supervisor.

Randall is studying for an associate degree in CCRI's Paralegal Studies program and has made the Dean's List. She is a volunteer for the Providence Rescue Mission, the Cranston Christian Fellowship Nursery and Bible School and a Fein-stein mentor to elementary school children.

The Association also granted \$250 awards to help 54 students defray the cost of books they needed for class and five awards to students in need of financial assistance.

Remembering Charles Sullivan

A tribute to the former professor of English, Foundation trustee

Retired Professor of English and Community College of Rhode Island Foundation Trustee Charles Sullivan died on May 27, 2010 at his home in Providence. He was passionate about teaching, adored his students and staunchly supported the arts. His sense of humor and genuine compassion are remembered by many and were celebrated during a memorial service on July 12.



In 2008, Charles became the 36th member of the CCRI Hall of Fame for his substantial contributions to the college. From his start at RIJC as an English professor in 1967 through his retirement in 2008, he was a tireless advocate for the arts. In honor of his 58th birthday in 2003, a small group of friends established the Charles Sullivan Fund for the Arts and Humanities with an endowment that today totals more than \$160,000. His annual Salute to the Arts event provides musical and dramatic entertainment and raises funding for the endowment.

A prolific writer of poetry, Sullivan served as book review editor for East Side Monthly. He was president of the Providence Athenaeum board, president of the Rhode Island Committee for the Humanities twice, vice president of the New England Foundation for the Humanities and was a member of the national Community College Humanities Association, helping to attract and direct the national conference to Rhode Island twice. He was also vice president of Higher Education for the National Education Association of Rhode Island in the 1980s.

Sullivan was a trustee of the CCRI Foundation and sponsored the Women Returning to School Scholarship. This scholarship focuses on women who have been out of high school for at least 10 years and wish to attend CCRI.
