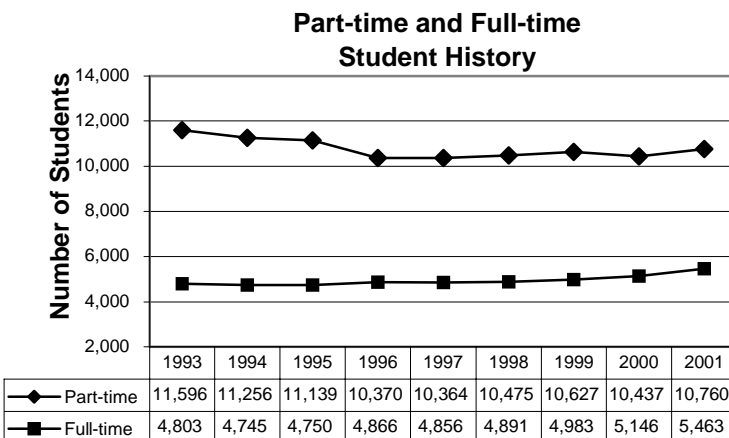

Overall, the total number of students enrolled in credit courses increased by 640 students from the fall of 2000 to the fall of 2001. Part-time students accounted for 66 percent of the fall 2001 headcount enrollment. Thirty-four percent of all students were enrolled as full-time students.

From the fall of 1993 to the fall of 2001, the degree status mix of full-time students increased from 91.5 percent to 93.6 percent while the percent of degree candidates in the part-time group grew from 63 percent to 72.4 percent for the same period.



Looking at the graph on the left, the most significant change seems to be an increase (15.1 percent) in the number of full-time students from 1994 to 2001.
