ASSESSMENT:

1. Identifies basic needs of the adult patient.
2. Gathers subjective and objective data by research in chart, reference resource, report, and physical assessment.
3. Distinguishes deviations from normal physiological functioning.
4. Identifies causative factors contributing to illness.
5. Assesses environment for safety hazards
6. Identifies technical skills to be performed.
7. Detects verbal and non-verbal cues from assigned patients.
8. Determines significance of laboratory and clinical data.
9. Identifies order for IV fluid administration.

NURSING DIAGNOSIS:

10. Formulates NANDA approved nursing diagnoses from assessment data.
11. Uses appropriate nursing diagnosis statements.

PLANNING:

12. Verifies all orders associated with a patient's therapeutic regime.
13. Collaborates with patient and family to establish realistic outcomes based on NOC- base taxonomy.
14. Develops measurable realistic outcomes from which to base plan of care.
15. Formulates a prioritized plan of care.
16. Explains scientific rationale for selected NIC-based nursing interventions.
17. Explains chemical intervention implications of drugs for assigned patients.
18. Plans timing of nursing care and medications in relation to individual patient needs.

IMPLEMENTATION:

19. Adheres to HIPAA regulations regarding confidentiality and patients' rights.
20. Ensures a safe patient environment.
21. Employs therapeutic communication skills.
22. Provides safe, effective, and evidence-based nursing care using critical thinking and sound judgment.
23. Applies principles of medical and surgical asepsis.
24. Administers all medications safely.
25. Supports patient/family choices.
26. Maintains an environment conducive to privacy and confidentiality.
27. Implements individualized plan of care.
28. Applies nursing research and theory to clinical practice
29. Provides patient/family teaching.
30. Acts as a patient advocate.
31. Promotes spiritual enhancement.
32. Demonstrates communication enhancement with presence.
33. Reports nursing assessments and interventions.
34. Records nursing assessments and interventions accurately and concisely.

35. Demonstrates transfer of skills and theory taught in NURS 1010 (Nursing I).
36. Administers IV fluids safely and accurately.
37. Utilize technology and information management tools to support patient care and improve outcomes.
38. Discuss quality indicators and how they can improve patient care.
