CLINICAL OUTCOMES

A Learning Contract may be initiated at any time at the Instructor's discretion.
FINAL Evaluation of clinical performance must be Satisfactory in all areas to pass the course.

ASSESSMENT:

1. Utilizes records, patient and other resources to assess patient's needs.
2. Appraises patient's behavioral patterns requiring psychiatric intervention.
3. Interprets Maslow's hierarchy of needs related to the child, his/her family, or adult.
4. Recognizes learning needs of the child and family, or adult with medical-surgical or psychiatric issues.
5. Analyzes the impact of socio-cultural factors on a healing environment.
6. States role in the management and delegation of patient care activities.

NURSING DIAGNOSIS:

7. Formulates NANDA approved nursing diagnoses.

PLANNING:

8. Establishes NOC based patient/family centered outcomes.
9. Constructs a clinical time management plan for the nursing team.
10. Prepares an individualized plan of care using NIC based interventions for the child and family, or adult.
11. Integrates knowledge gained from community resource visits into plans of care.

IMPLEMENTATION:

12. Displays therapeutic verbal and nonverbal communication with children, families, and adults.
13. Delivers the plan of care to the patient and family in a safe, cost effective, and caring manner.
14. Implements the plan of care incorporating management principles selectively in the acute or long term care setting.
15. Teaches health promotion strategies.
16. Advocates for the child and family or adult patient.
17. Adheres to HIPAA regulations regarding confidentiality and patients' rights.
18. Communicates pertinent patient health status data.

EVALUATION:

19. Determines the effectiveness of nursing interventions.
20. Rates patient's/family's progress toward outcome achievement.

PROFESSIONAL/PERSONAL GROWTH:

21. Practices professional conduct.
22. Uses constructive communication skills in peer, staff, and faculty interactions.
23. Embodies the role of the Practical Nurse according to the Nurse Practice Act.
24. Elicits a positive response from the patient and/or family, i.e., patient states "feeling better" as a result of caring behaviors.
25. Relates understanding of one's effect on others.
26. Contributes to group/team activities.
27. Identifies personal strengths and weaknesses in delivery of nursing care.
