

## TRANSFER AGREEMENT

### From the Community College of Rhode Island to New England Institute of Technology

1. New England Institute of Technology (NEIT) assures the acceptance of a Community College of Rhode Island (CCRI) associate degree graduate who has earned a grade point average of 2.0 or higher (on a 4.0 scale) into its Bachelor of Science in Business Management Technology program. Students who are accepted with 62-64 transfer credits will be classified as juniors. Regardless of the student's major at CCRI, the following courses\* must be completed in order to be eligible under this agreement:


\*The curricula of NEIT are modified routinely in response to industry demands and as required at the discretion of NEIT; therefore, the required NEIT courses listed above may change. NEIT shall advise CCRI in writing when required NEIT courses change.

2. Transfer students will receive academic credit for all college-level courses applied toward the requirements of the associate degree in which the student earned a grade of "C" or above and subject to NEIT's Transfer of Credit policy as published in its catalog. A maximum of sixty four credits will be accepted for transfer.

3. Non-credit or remedial courses adjudged to be below college level may not be accepted for transfer.

4. It is understood that if a student does not have the foundation or skill to enroll in an upper level course because he/she has not taken introductory courses, he/she will be required to take any necessary prerequisites(s). Therefore, New England Institute of Technology cannot assure every student the completion of requirements for the baccalaureate degree in six quarters. It is also understood that this transfer agreement does not articulate the reverse transfer process for students seeking an associate degree or certificate at the Community College of Rhode Island.

5. The New England Institute of Technology catalog contains all information about degree requirements. Students wishing to plan their associate degree program to ensure meeting prerequisites for upper division courses are encouraged to communicate early with the transfer counselor at New England Institute of Technology to secure specific information about transfer credits.
6. This agreement will be reviewed bi-annually and may be revised at any time by mutual agreement.
7. The agreement may be terminated by either party with not less than one year's notice.
